

HEALTH OFFICER.

1912, ch. 695, sec. 245.

657. There shall be a health officer appointed in the same manner as other appointments are made, who shall be a reputable practicing physician whose duty it shall be to have charge of any supervision over all matters of health and health regulations, within the town and he shall receive such salary or compensation as the Mayor and City Council shall fix.

1912, ch. 695, sec. 246.

658. It shall be the duty of every physician residing and practicing medicine within the town of Laurel to make a return to the Collector of all births and deaths; and also of all contagious and infectious diseases and report the same to the practicing physicians in said town, and the said Collector shall also keep a record thereof in a well-bound book or books to be provided for the said purposes. The said Collector shall issue burial permits, and no burial or interment shall take place within the town limits until a permit for the same has been issued by the said Collector.

SAVING CLAUSE.

659. All ordinances and resolutions of the Mayor and City Council of Laurel shall remain in force and have the same legal effect as when enacted, the intention being not to repeal by any provision hereof any of the said ordinances, unless they be in conflict herewith.

STREET IMPROVEMENTS.

1894, ch. 545, sec. 246G. 1912 Code, sec. 403.

660. The Mayor and City Council of Laurel, on the written request of a majority of the land owners on any street in Laurel, desiring to have the said street improved, shall have the power and is hereby authorized to improve the streets of Laurel with brick or other permanent sidewalks, stone guttering and curbing, and stone or other permanent carriage ways after first grading and otherwise preparing for proper drainage the streets to be improved according to a uniform system of grades to be established by said Mayor and City Council, and according to which all constructions on said streets shall conform.

661. The total costs of improvements of each street improved, shall be ascertained by the Mayor and City Council when and as said improvements are made, and after deducting the costs of the streets crossings and of the improvements of the intersections along the line of the street improved, which street crossing and intersections of streets shall be paid for entirely and exclusively by the Mayor and City Council, the balance of said total
