The Mayor shall designate and appoint three of the Council to sit as a board to make transfers and abatements of taxes and assessments of said town and to hear appeals of all persons who feel aggrieved by any assessment, and the sittings of the said board shall be on the first Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of June of each year, and their hours shall be from 7.30 P. M. to 9 P. M., and each member of said board shall receive as compensation \$5 for his entire service rendered. At the first regular meeting of the Council after the regular election, the Mayor shall appoint, subject to the confirmation of the Council, a person, not a member of the Council, whose official title shall be "Town Clerk," to serve for two years from June 1st following, or until his successor shall be duly appointed and qualified, and it shall be his duty to attend all meetings of the Council and act as Clerk thereof; he shall be collector of taxes and of all other sums receivable, and Treasurer of the town and shall be at the Council Room, or Town Clerk's Office, on such days and hours as may be provided by ordinance or resolution, and he shall perform such other duties as the Charter of Easton may provide and the Mayor and Council may by ordinance or resolution direct, and he shall receive for his services such sum per annum, payable in monthly installments, as the Mayor and Council may by ordinance determine.
