The Board of Supervisors of Elections of Baltimore County shall cause to be stricken from the list of qualified voters on the registration books thereof before the next election in Baltimore County the names of all persons residing in that portion of the Eleventh District by this Act made a part of the Ninth Election District and shall cause such names so stricken off as aforesaid to be transferred to the registration books of the Ninth Election District of Baltimore County.

The Board of Supervisors of Elections of Baltimore County, in their judgment and discretion, from time to time may subdivide the election precincts of the Ninth and Eleventh Election Districts, as now established, or to subdivide and change the boundaries of any precinct or establish additional precincts in either the said Ninth or Eleventh Districts of Baltimore County and they are hereby empowered and authorized to make such subdivision or additions and to establish the boundaries of such subdivision or additions in such way as to facilitate and expedite the casting of their ballots by the voters thereof; provided, however, that no one precinct in either of said districts shall contain less than 300 voters and whenever in the exercise of the discretion conferred upon the Board of Supervisors of Elections by this Act they shall appoint officers of registration and judges and clerks of election thereof as provided by the General Laws of the State of Maryland and the officers of registration and judges and clerks shall perform all the duties as provided in the General Laws.
