**405.** Every justice of the peace appointed under this subdivision of this article shall file with the County Commissioners of Baltimore County on the first Wednesday of each and every month an account, verified by his oath or affirmation, of all fines, forfeitures and penalties imposed by him under the laws of the State and received during the preceding month; which said account shall show the names of the respective defendants, the Acts of Assembly, provisions of law, or charges under which said fines, forfeitures and penalties were respectively imposed, and the amounts paid in each case by the said respective defendants; and the said justices of the peace, at the time of filing said account, the station house justice selected to sit at the Canton station house excepted, shall pay over to the County Commissioners the amount of said fines, penalties and forfeitures so received for the use of the county; and the justice of the peace selected to sit at the station house at Canton, in the Twelfth Election District, as aforesaid, in addition to filing a monthly account and report as above, shall make a daily report of and pay over to the marshal of police all fines, forfeitures and penalties collected as aforesaid during the preceding day, and in addition thereto shall account for and pay over to said marshal of police all fees taxed as costs and paid by the parties against whom judgment was rendered, as provided for in Section 404; the said marshal of police to make weekly returns of and to pay over all such fines, penalties, forfeitures and fees collected by him, as aforesaid, to the County Commissioners on Tuesday of each and every week; and upon the failure of said justice of the peace selected to sit at the station house at Canton, or of said marshal of police, respectively, to account for and pay over all fines, forfeitures, penalties and costs, as aforesaid, and at the times and in the manner specified, he shall be liable to indictment by the grand jury of Baltimore County, and upon conviction shall be fined not less than twenty dollars nor more than one hundred dollars, and shall be disqualified from holding his office.

**406.** If any justice of the peace shall not have imposed or received any such fines, forfeitures or penalties, as aforesaid, during the month preceding the date fixed for the making of said returns, he shall file an affidavit or affirmation to that effect at the time prescribed for filing said account.

**407.** The County Commissioners of Baltimore County are authorized and empowered to require at any time any justice of the peace of said county to produce before them his criminal docket for examination.
