Every wagon, carriage, omnibus, sleigh, pushcart, bicycle, tricycle and other conveyance, except baby carriages, in whatever manner or by what force or power the same may be driven, ridden or propelled, which is or may be used for or adapted to pleasure, riding or the transportation of passengers, baggage or merchandise upon the streets or roads, and every draught or riding animal, whether driven, ridden or led, excepting that an animal or animals attached to any vehicle, shall, with such vehicle, constitute a vehicle. Any person violating any provisions or regulations hereof shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined for each and every offense any sum not less than one dollar and not exceeding twenty-five dollars.
