The teachers or persons appointed by the Board of School Commissioners shall make all necessary arrangements for supplying the books and other stationery required for the different schools and for lighting and heating the buildings, subject to the approval of the Board of Public School Commissioners of Baltimore County, and to be paid for by the said Board of County School Commissioners.

The County Commissioners of said county shall pay over to the treasurer of the said Board of County School Commissioners of Baltimore County upon the order of the said board the taxes levied and collected for school purposes in said county at such times and in such amount as shall be necessary; provided, the collections from the school levy shall be sufficient for said purpose, and when there are not sufficient funds on hand from the school levy the said Commissioners, at their discretion, are authorized to advance a sufficient sum to supply such deficiency from any other funds not immediately demandable for other county purposes.

The Board of County School Commissioners of Baltimore County may establish kindergarten schools in said county wherever and whenever they may in their judgment deem it necessary, and subject to such regulations as they may establish; the expense of conducting such kindergarten schools to be defrayed in the same manner as the other public schools of said county.
