

there; and the name of each from and charged to such county or the City of Baltimore, as the case may be, and the cost of maintenance due from said county and the City of Baltimore for such colored minor at said rate, and the Board of County Commissioners of said counties and the mayor and city council of Baltimore, shall pay the House of Reformation at the end of each quarter of the calendar year an amount equal to the rate of two hundred dollars (\$200) per annum for each colored minor committed to the House of Reformation and actually there, and certified to the County Commissioners of the respective counties and the Comptroller of Baltimore City by the Board of Managers of the House of Reformation as of the first days of January, April, July and October respectively in each year.

Montrose School for Girls.

632.¹ For each white female minor committed to the care and training of the Montrose School for Girls² from the City of Baltimore or any one of the counties in the State, the said city or county, as the case may be, shall, as herein specified, pay into the State Treasury the sum of one hundred and eighty dollars (\$180.00) per annum, for the care and training of such white female minor, and the remaining amount required for the care and training of such white female minor shall be paid from the Treasury of the State, and the said city or county, as the case may be, shall, as herein specified, pay unto the State Treasurer the sum of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) per annum, for each white female minor paroled and under the control of the Montrose School for Girls, for supervising said white female minors. The expense for care, training and supervision of all white female minors in the Montrose School for Girls and on parole and under its control shall be a charge upon each county and City of Baltimore, committing such white female minor or minors to the Montrose School for Girls, as hereinafter provided. It shall be the duty of the Board of Managers of the Montrose School for Girls to furnish to the County Treasurer and to the Comptroller of the City of Baltimore, having white female minors committed to the Montrose School for Girls a quarterly statement giving the number of white female minors and the name of each white female minor from and charged to such county or the City of Baltimore, as the case may be, and the cost of maintenance and supervision due from said county and the City of Baltimore for such white female minor or minors. The Board of Managers of the Montrose School for Girls shall certify to the State Comptroller on the first days of January, April, July and October of each year, the amount not previously certified to by him, that is due the said Montrose School for Girls from the several counties and the City of Baltimore, having white female
