Candidates for Member of Congress of the United States shall file their said Certificates of Nomination with the Secretary of State at Annapolis, and the Secretary of State, immediately upon receipt of the same, shall certify the fact of said filing and the name and description of each person so filing said certificate as specified therein to the Supervisors of Elections of the various counties comprising the particular Congressional District, and of Baltimore City, if said district be wholly or partially within said city, and of which Congressional District the candidate is a bona fide citizen and registered voter. Said candidates for Con-
