2. Title and Jurisdiction. There shall be a department to be known as the State Insurance Department of Maryland which shall be charged with the execution of the laws of this State in relation to insurance, and which shall be assigned to the Division of Financial Review and Control, and with respect to its administrative as distinguished from its judicial, semi-judicial or discretionary functions shall be under the supervision and direction of the Comptroller. The principal office of the said Department shall be located in the City of Baltimore.

5. Deputy Insurance Commissioner. There shall also be a Deputy Insurance Commissioner, who shall be appointed by the commissioner, and who, in the event of the absence, death, resignation, disability or disqualification of the commissioner, or in case the office of commissioner shall for any cause become vacant, shall have and exercise all the powers and duties vested by law in the commissioner. He shall give bond to the commissioner in such penalty as shall be determined by the commissioner, and shall receive an annual compensation as fixed and provided by the budget.
