When the militia of this State, or any part thereof, is called or ordered under the Constitution and laws of the United States, into the active military service of the United States, the Governor shall order out for service the Organized Militia, or such part thereof as may be necessary and if the number available be insufficient he shall order out such part of the unorganized militia as he may deem necessary.

5. The militia of this State shall be divided into two classes: the organized militia and the unorganized militia. The organized militia shall consist of the regularly enlisted members of the militia, and such other persons between the ages of forty-five and sixty-four as are authorized to enlist therein by the Governor, organized, armed and equipped, and of commissioned officers between the ages of twenty-one and sixty-four; provided, that a military office for which no salary is provided in the Budget,
