- 12. Any person who by means of a wilfully false statement or representation, or by impersonation, or other fraudulent device, obtains, or attempts to obtain, or aids or abets any person to obtain:
 - (a) A pension to which he or she is not entitled;
 - (b) A larger pension than that to which he or she is lawfully entitled;
 - (c) Payment of any forfeited installment;
- (d) Or aids or abets in buying or in any way disposing of the property of a pensioner without the consent of the Local Board or the Department of Welfare of Baltimore City, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not more than five hundred dollars, or be imprisoned in the county or city jail for not more than one year, or be punished by both such fine and imprisonment, in the discretion of the Court, and shall in addition, if a pensioner, forfeit and pay a sum equal to the total of all pension payments or excess pension payments so wrongfully obtained, together with six per cent. interest on each such payment or excess payment.
