- ments; board to order discontinuance of, and changes in method; permits; plans showing existing methods submitted to board.
- 383. Where water or ice is from source which is or likely to become dangerous, or sewerage is or is likely to become dangerous, Board of Health may close up source or place of sewage discharge; changes to remedy conditions; condemnation of sources of supply or sewage disposal.
- 384. Property upon which there is a spring, well, cesspool, privy, etc., which may become prejudicial to health, may be ordered connected with water supply or sewerage system if there is one available, and spring, etc., abandoned; board may prevent construction of well, cesspool, privy, etc.; condemnation of structures.
- 385. Board of Health to have supervision over water for potable purposes and method of bottling, etc.; permits; water from outside of Maryland.
- 386. Board of Health to have supervision over ice used for domestic purposes; permits; place of storage and handling of; rules and regulations.
- 387. Records to be kept by counties, cities, corporations, etc., supplying water, ice or sewerage service; access to buildings.
- 388. Permits revocable and subject to change after notice; permits issued for specified period.
- 389. Counties, cities, corporations, etc., may appeal from order of Board of Health; procedure; action to have precedence; appeal to Court of Appeals.
