CHAP. 56.

*A supplement to the act, entitled an act to divorce Josephine Hawke, of the City of Annapolis, from her husband Richard James Hawke, a mensa et thoro.* Passed Mar. 30, 1841.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* To use maiden name  
That Josephine Hawke, who was divorced from her husband Richard James Hawke, by act of Assembly of December session, eighteen hundred and forty, be and she is hereby authorised and empowered to resume, take and use her maiden name of Josephine Street Elworthy.

CHAPTER 55.

*An act to alter and amend the Constitution of this State.* Passed April 6, 1841.

**SECTION 1.** *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That it shall not be lawful for the Legislature of this State, to authorise any loans upon the credit of this State, which are not redcemable at the pleasure of the State, until the proposed loans are sanctioned by an act passed at the session of the General Assembly next succeeding that at which they are proposed and passed, so that the opinion of the people of the State may be expressed thereon. Any loan upon credit of State to receive sanction of two legislatures

**SEC. 2.** *And be it enacted,* That if this act shall be confirmed at the next General Assembly, the same shall be considered as a part of the constitution and form of government of this State. If this act be confirmed

CHAPTER 56.

*An act for the payment of the Journal of Accounts.* Passed April 6, 1841.
