CHESAPEAKE CITY.

The Act of August 15, 1861, ch. 87, repeals section 46 of this Article and substitutes the following:

SEC. 1. If any person shall refuse or neglect to pay his taxes, fines or forfeitures, the said commissioners may collect the same, in the same manner as other taxes, fines and forfeitures are collected.

NORTH-EAST.

The Act of 1862, ch. 103, repeals section 130, and substitutes the following:

2. If any person shall refuse or neglect to pay his taxes, fines or forfeitures, the said commissioners may collect the same, in the same manner as other taxes, fines or forfeitures are collected.

PORT DEPOSIT.

The Act of June 12, 1861, ch 36, adds the following:

3. The president and commissioners of the village of Port Deposit shall have the power to pass ordinances regulating the market, the inspection, measurement, and weight of all provisions sold in and to be consumed in said village; to suppress all disorderly meetings, to prevent firing guns, squibs, or any kind
