#### ALMS-HOUSE.

The Act of 1862, ch. 50, repeals section 25 of this article and substitutes the following :

SEC. 1. The trustees of the poor for Dorchester county may, out of the money so levied, keep any number of out-pensioners they may think proper; *provided*, the amount paid therefor, in any one year, shall not exceed the sum of one thousand dollars, and no out-pension shall be allowed to any person who is not a fit subject to be received into the alms-house.

#### CAMBRIDGE.

The Act of 1862, ch 61, repeals section 33 and substitutes the following :

2. The free white male inhabitants of said town, above the age of twenty-one years, who have resided within the limits of said town for one year next preceding the election, and free white male persons above the age of twenty-one years, not residents of said town, having a freehold estate or leasehold property for a term exceeding twenty-one years in said town, shall, on the second Saturday of March annually, at the court house in
