### CIRCUIT COURTS.

Chapter 84 amends and re-enacts section 9, as follows :

SEC. 1. There shall be three regular common law terms of the Circuit Court for Allegany county, commencing at Cumberland on the first Monday in January, second Monday in April and the first Monday in October in each year.

Passed February 5, 1864.

### COUNTY COMMISSIONERS.

Chapter 164 amends and re-enacts section 15, as follows :

2. They shall be entitled to three dollars a day for each day they are in session, and twelve cents a mile for going to and returning from each meeting, if they reside out of Cumberland; but such mileage shall not be allowed more than once for a session of two or more consecutive days.
