

CITY OF CUMBERLAND.

Chapter 121 repeals sections 23, 31, 32, 33, 35, 53, 54, and enacts the following in their stead:

3. The survey made under the authority of the mayor and city councilmen of the town of Cumberland, and entered upon the record of their proceedings and recorded in the office of the clerk of the Circuit Court for Allegany county, shall constitute the bounds and limits of said city; *provided*, however, that for all sanitary and police purpose the mayor and councilmen of said city shall have and exercise full authority and control for one-half mile in every direction beyond the bounds and limits above mentioned.

4. The mayor and councilmen may provide, by ordinance, for the appointment of a clerk and such other officers as to them may seem fit for the proper execution and performance of the powers and duties conferred on them by the laws of the State, and their act of incorporation.

5. The mayor shall be allowed salary, not exceeding two hundred [hundred] dollars, the councilmen shall be allowed a per diem not exceeding two dollars per day for each day of service, but the total per diem of any councilman shall not exceed forty dollars per annum, and the salaries of all other officers appointed by said mayor and councilmen shall be fixed by ordinance at such reasonable and economical rates as to them may seem just and proper.

6. The mayor and councilmen may pass all such ordinances not contrary to the Constitution and laws of this State, as they may deem necessary for the good government of said city; they shall have power to remove all nuisances and obstructions from the streets, lanes and alleys, and from any lots adjoining thereto; they shall have power to remove or cause to be removed any houses or other buildings that may become dangerous on any account; they shall have power to cause the streets, lanes, alleys and sidewalks to be paved, repaired and improved; they shall
