

ARTICLE LVI.

Licenses.

BILLIARDS.

Chapter 56 amends sections 6, 7, as follows :

SEC. 1. Any person or persons proposing to keep or offer for use, a billiard table or tables, shall before doing so, apply to the clerk authorized to issue licenses, for a license for each and every table kept or exhibited for use by him or them, and shall pay for each and every license to keep one billiard table, the sum of one hundred dollars, or if he or they propose to keep or exhibit for use, more billiard tables than one, there shall be paid by him or them for each and every such billiard table more than one, a license of fifty dollars.

2. Any person or persons keeping or exhibiting for use a billiard table or tables without first obtaining a license therefor, shall for each and every table so kept or exhibited, forfeit and pay the sum of five hundred dollars, one-half to the informer and the other half to the State.

Passed March 10, 1865.

HAWKERS AND PEDDLERS.

Chapter 76 repeals section 22, and enacts the following in lieu thereof.—(I. Supplement, 53.)

3. No such license shall be granted to any hawker or peddler in the name or style of a partnership or company, and but one person shall trade under any such license. No such license shall extend beyond the county in which it may be issued.
