

perpetual succession, and shall be able and capable in law to sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded, in any court of law, and to make all such by-laws necessary for the purposes herein mentioned.

4. The citizens of Templeville shall hold an election on the second Wednesday in August, or as soon thereafter as may be convenient, and each and every year thereafter, for seven commissioners, who shall have the management of the town, and shall appoint a bailiff and prescribe his duties; *provided, however*, the said bailiff so appointed shall keep or cause to be kept in order, the roads leading to and from the said town of Templeville, for one mile; *and, provided further*, that the said commissioners shall describe the boundaries of said town, fix the compensation of the bailiff, cause to be assessed and levy and collect a tax on all the taxable property within the limits of the incorporation created by this act, for the purposes of carrying into effect this act and the improvement of the said town.

5. All persons entitled to vote for delegates to the General Assembly of Maryland, shall be entitled to vote for commissioners of the said town of Templeville.

6. A majority of the commissioners shall constitute a quorum to transact business, and in case of a vacancy in the board of commissioners during the year, the remaining commissioners shall have power to fill the vacancy, until the regular town election, for electing town commissioners.
