CONTESTED ELECTIONS.

1865, c. 143 repeals and re-enacts section 52 as follows:

1865, c 143. What contested elections decided by house of delegates.

52. All contested elections for comptroller of the treasury, commissioner of the land office, judges, clerks of the courts of law, and register of wills, shall be decided by the house of delegates, and the testimony shall be taken in such cases in the same manner as is herein prescribed in contested seats of the senate or house of delegates.

In force from June 1, 1865.

United States Senators.

1867, c. 11 repeals section 74, and enacts the following:

1867, c 11 · U S senators

74. In the first election of senator to represent where to be in this state in the senate of the United States, which habitants. shall be held after the first day of April, in the year eighteen hundred and sixty seven, the person elected shall be an inhabitant of the eastern shore of this state, and one of the senators to be there after elected, shall always be an inhabitant of the eastern shore, and the other of the western shore of this state.

In force from January 24, 1867.

Representatives in Congress.

1862, c. 228 repeals sections 79, 80, 81, 82, 83, 84, 85 and 86, and substitutes the following in lieu thereof.

1862, c 228. Division of state into five congressional districts.

79. This state shall be divided into five districts for the choosing of five representatives in the congress of the United States, which shall be numbered from one to five.

First congres-sional district.

80. The first congressional district shall be composed of Worcester county, Somerset county, Dorchester county, Talbot county, Caroline county,
