city of Baltimore, or the county of their residence, on the days appointed by law for holding state, county, congressional or presidential elections of this state, or on the days appointed by the proper authority for holding special elections to fill vacancies, such qualified voters shall be entitled at such time to exercise the right of suffrage as fully as if they were present at their usual places of voting.

The county commissioners of the respective counties, and the mayor and city council of Baltimnre, shall, at least twenty days before any general election, appoint one or more persons, if they shall deem it necessary, to act as judges at such election, and two or more counties may appoint the same judge or judges of election, and shall furnish the poll books and other matters necessary for the holding and conducting of said election for their own county and the city of Baltimore, respectively; and it shall be the duty of said judge or judges to keep separate the ballots and poll books for each county, or the legislative districts of the city of Baltimore, and in all other respects said elections shall be conducted as provided for in the constitution and laws of the state, and whenever the mayor and city coun-
