lected by any constable in the district where such offence may have been committed, in the same manner of other small debts; one-half of said fine shall be paid to the informer, and the other half into the public school fund of Worcester county; provided, Proviso that nothing herein contained shall be intended to apply to any of the waters of said river, below a point called and known by the name of Porter's Bridge.

26. Any person deeming himself or herself ag-Right to appeal grieved by any judgment of a justice of the peace under this act, shall be entitled to an appeal to the circuit court of the county, as in other cases of appeal from judgments of justices of the peace.

## ARTICLE XLII.

## Governor.

- Governor authorized to appoint a messenger: compensation and duties.
- 20. Governor annually to appoint keeper of public buildings, &c: his duties.
  - 21. Watchmen, their duties, &c.
- 22. Keeper of the steam house, &c: assistant.
  - 23. Salaries authorized to be paid.
  - 24. Vacancies in office filled by governor.

1862, c. 225 amends and re-enacts section 5 as follows:

SEC. 5. The governor may appoint a messenger to Governor the executive, who shall be the keeper of the water authorized to closets attached to the state house, and shall keep senger, his the same cleaned, ventilated and supplied with water, and duties and in every respect in thorough order, who shall hold his office at the pleasure of the governor, and shall receive an annual salary of five hundred dollars.

In force from March 8, 1862. This act also provided for the office of private secretary, which is abolished by Const. 1867, Art. II, sec. 22.
