In any prosecution for bartering or selling any goods, wares or merchandise, or spirituous or fermented liquor or lager beer without license, it shall be sufficient for the State to prove that the party indicted, exposed or offered for sale such goods, wares, merchandise, or spirituous or fermented liquor or lager beer, or kept any store or place at or in which goods, wares or merchandise, or spirituous liquor or lager beer were exposed or offered for sale.

It shall be the duty of the sheriff of Baltimore city, annually, in the month of April, to make or cause to be made, an alphabetical list of the names of all the persons or bodies corporate or politic, in each ward of the city of Baltimore, who shall be exercising or pursuing any business or be doing any act or thing or shall be in the use or occupation of any house or place for any purpose for which a license is made necessary by this article of the code, and to return such list to the grand jury of said city at as early a period as practicable, after the first day of May then next ensuing; and the said sheriff shall within the first week of the month of April, cause a notice to be inserted in the daily papers of the city, cautioning all persons and bodies corporate or politic, whom it may concern, to obtain a license or renew the same on or before the first day of May
