The uniform series of text books shall be pre- Ibid s 2. scribed by the state board of education, and may be scribe, contract contracted for by them as hereinbefore provided for, tribute same and shall be distributed by the state superintendent to the boards of school commissioners, in quantities, and at times as advised by them.

66. On the first day of July, each year, the several schedule of boards of city and county school commissioners, may books and send to the office of the state superintendent, a wanted, to be schedule of books and stationery required for the intendent. use of schools in their cities and counties, during the following school year, stating when and in what quantities they shall be forwarded; bills of books for- Bills for books warded shall be made out and sent to the board of school commissioners, who shall immediately pay for the same.

The accounts for purchase and distribution of Ibid 8.4. text books and stationery, shall be kept separate and of text books distinct from all other accounts connected with the kept. office of the state superintendent, and a full statement of contracts, receipts and disbursements, shall be made annually to the governor or general assembly, and appended to the report of said superintendent.

68. The boards of school commissioners shall de How books, &c., cide how the text books and stationery shall be dis-distributed or tributed, and upon what terms they shall be sold, or sold the use of them be granted to pupils; provided, Proviso. always, that the district commissioner is of opinion that the parent or guardian of any pupil is unable to pay the expense of books, he may then permit the use of books to such pupil free of all charge.

69. There shall be a special clerk appointed by the superintend-state superintendent, who shall attend to receiving ent's clerk to and distributing text books and stationery, and shall tribute books, keep all accounts connected therewith, and perform such other duties as the superintendent may direct, receiving for his services the sum of eight hundred His salary. dollars per annum, payable quarterly by the treas-
