

Baltimore Female College, are continued until otherwise ordered by the general assembly, subject to the condition that they shall afford tuition in all the branches taught, and use of books free of charge, to one student for every hundred dollars that such college receives from the state; in accordance with which requirements the further sum of seven hundred dollars in addition to the present donation, shall, on warrant of the comptroller of the state, be annually paid on the first day of April, of each year, to the president of the board of trustees of the Baltimore Female College, for the support of said institution; the above colleges shall report annually to the state superintendent, in such form as may be ordered by the board of education, and comply with all the other requirements of article eighty-four of the Public General Laws.

Appropriation to faculty of arts and sciences.

80. The sum of three thousand dollars shall, on warrant of the comptroller, be paid annually by the treasurer, to the faculty of arts and sciences of the university of Maryland, situate in Baltimore, for the support of the college department; said faculty to afford tuition in all branches taught, and use of books, free of charge, to one student for every hundred dollars received from the state.

81. The faculty of arts and sciences of the university of Maryland, shall report annually to the state superintendent, according to such form as may be ordered by the state board of education, and comply with all other requirements of article eighty-four of the Public General Laws, as they apply to colleges.

82. St. John's College, Annapolis; Washington College, Chestertown; the Maryland Agricultural College, Prince George's county, and the faculty of arts and sciences, and the law school shall constitute the university of Maryland, to be controlled and governed as may be directed.

83. The law school of the university of Maryland, shall be located at Annapolis, and be connected with St. John's College, Annapolis, with the consent of
