135. The state librarian shall furnish for the office Librarian to of the state superintendent of public instruction, furnish code, &c. copies of the code and laws of subsequent dates, the constitutions of Maryland, and journals and debates of the constitutional conventions of 1850 and 1864.

#### SCHOOLS.

### 1864, c. 90 enacts the following:
