vided, he is in other respects entitled to vote, by Proviso. having the requisite qualifications, of age, citizenship, and residence, and be not disqualified under the third and fifth sections of the first article of the constitution; and if any officer of registration shall Penalty for refuse to register as a qualified voter, any person so ance. as aforesaid applying to be registered or if any judge of election shall refuse to receive the vote of such person when registered, he shall upon conviction thereof, before any court having criminal jurisdiction, forfeit and pay a fine of not less than one hundred and not more than five hundred dollars for each offence and be imprisoned until said fine and the costs of prosecution be fully paid and satisfied, and shall also be liable in an action for damages at Action. the suit of the party aggrieved.

33. All courts and state, county, township and Ibid. s. 3. municipal officers of this state shall take notice of courts and the provisions of this act, without requiring it to be specially pleaded, set up or relied on, and shall give the full effect and benefit thereof to any person embraced within the general description of the first section of this act, in the same manner and to the same extent as if the name of such person had been expressed, and set out specially in the said foregoing section.
