Collectors' bonds.

34. Every collector of city or county taxes, before he acts as such, shall give bond to the state of Maryland, in a penalty of double the amount of such tax to be collected by him, with good and sufficient securities, to be approved in the several counties by the county commissioners, and in the city of Baltimore by the mayor and president of both branches of the city council, or any two of them, the mayor being one, with condition that if the above bound shall well and faithfully execute his office, and shall account for and pay to the county commissioners, (or to the mayor and city council of Baltimore, if in Baltimore city,) or their order, the several sums of money which he shall receive for the county or city, (as the case may be,) or be answerable for by law, at such times as the law shall direct, and every collector of state taxes shall also give a separate bond to the state of Maryland, in a penalty double the amount of tax to be collected by him, with good and sufficient sureties, to be approved by the governor, with
