1864, c. 269 enacts the following:

SEC. 1. A state vaccine agency is hereby established, said agency to be located in the city of Baltimore, in which shall be kept at all times a supply of fresh and good vaccine virus, not more than two removes from the cow, for the use of the physicians of this state.

2. The governor, by and with the advice and consent of the senate, shall once in six years appoint as state vaccine agent, one physician of good character and standing, to reside in the city of Baltimore, whose duty it shall be to make and renew from the cow as often as it may be necessary to keep on hand a supply of vaccine virus, not more than two removes from the cow, and to furnish such virus, to the physicians of the state when called for. He shall keep a record of the name, location and different times, qualities and quantities of virus furnished to
