other evidence of debt, and the amount thereof; if an open account, the interest due thereon up to the date of the passage, shall be stated separately; if a note, bond, bill obligatory, judgment, or other evidence of debt, the date thereof, and the date from which interest begins to run, shall also be stated, and other particulars of such claims; and the entry of a claim upon such book shall be taken as notice to the administrator of its existence; and the register of wills shall be entitled to receive, for making such entry of each claim, the sum of ten cents, to be paid by the claimant.

ORPHANS' COURT.

1865, c. 169 repeals all the sections of the articles of the Public Local Laws, relating to the pay and mileage of the judges of the Orphans' Courts, and adds the following section to take place after section 227.

1865, c. 169.
Pay of judges.

227. The judges of the orphans' courts of the several counties shall each receive the sum of four dollars, and the judges of the orphans' court of Baltimore city, shall receive six dollars for every days' attendance upon the sessions of said court, to be paid by the counties and city of Baltimore, respectively.

REGISTER OF WILLS.

1861. c. 83 repeals section 253 and substitutes the following:

Register's
bond.

253. The register of wills, in each county, before he acts as such, shall give bond with two good and sufficient securities, in the penal sum of seven thousand dollars, payable to this state, conditioned for the faithful performance of his said office of register of wills, which bond shall be taken, and securities approved by the judges of the orphans' court, and recorded in the office of the clerk of the circuit court
