as the executor or executors appointed by will could or might do.

282. In all cases of sales of real estate heretofore Where purmade or hereafter to be made by any executor or ex-chaser does not ecutors, or administator de bonis non with the will terms of sale. annexed, and the purchaser or purchasers shall fail, neglect or refuse to comply with the terms of sale, as reported to and ratified by the court, it shall and may be lawful for the orphans' courts of the several counties of the state and the city of Baltimore, upon the application of such executor, executors or administrators de bonis non with the will annexed, to pass an order requiring such purchaser or purchasers to comply with said terms of sale, or show good cause to the contrary, on or before a certain day to be limited in said order, and upon failure to comply with such terms of sale, or show good cause to the contrary, on or before the day limited in such order, it shall and may be lawful for the said orphan's courts to order a re-sale of such real estate at the risk and cost of the purchaser or purchasers, or to enforce compliance of any orders passed upon such application by attachment.

1866, c. 81 repeals and re-enacts 1865, c. 162, s. 3, thus:

283. The orphans' courts of the state shall have 1886. c. 81. concurrent jurisdiction with the several circuit jurisdiction of courts of this state, as courts of equity, with like in sales of in-powers to adopt rules and regulations, so as to au-estates. thorize and direct the sales of real estate of intestates, where the appraised value of said real estate shall not exceed the sum of twenty-five hundred dollars, and to confirm and ratify said sales in the same manner as such sales are confirmed and ratified by the several circuit courts of the state as courts of equity.

1865, c. 162 further enacts as fellows:

284. Upon the ratification by said orphans' court, 1865, c. 162, s. 4. the administrator shall proceed to convey the title title.
