1867, c. 317 repeals and re-enacts section 20 as follows:

20. The size and dimensions of the corn barrel 1807, c. 317. measure shall be as follows: twenty-one inches in sions of corn barrel measure, diameter (clear of staves) at the bottom, (and twenty- &c. three inches in diameter clear of staves) and shall hold five struck bushels of corn, and all the lime sold in this state, or delivered in this state to any person or persons, shall be measured in a bushel measure of the following dimensions, viz: twelve inches (clear of staves) at the bottom, and fifteen inches in diameter (clear of staves) at the top, and shall be fifteen high inside perpendicular measure, and in all cases where the lime has already slacked, it shall require two such bushels to make one bushel of quick lime; any person violating the provisions of this section Penalty. shall, on conviction in any court of this state, or before any justice of the peace, be fined not less than fifty dollars nor more than five hundred dollars, onehalf to the informer, and the other half to go to the public school fund of the state.

1865, c. 12 amends section 5 as follows:

SEC. 5.
