ALMSHOUSE.

1867, c. 362 repeals sections 27, 28 and 29 of this article and substitutes the following:

SEC. 27. If any person shall, without the consent in writing of the trustees or overseers of the almshouse, sell, give, dispose of or barter any spirituous or fermented liquors to any pauper connected with or living at said almshouse, he shall, on conviction before any justice of the peace of said county, be fined not less than five dollars nor more than twenty-five dollars for each offence, in the discretion of the justice.

1867, c. 240 repeals sections 30, 34, 35, 41, 42, 43, 44, 45, 46, 47, 48 and 62 and substitutes the following:
