293. The governor, by and with the advice and Appointment consent of the senate, shall biennially appoint an of inspector of inspector of salted fish in the city of Baltimore.

294. The inspector so appointed shall enter into Inspector's bond to the state of Maryland, with good and sufficient securities, to be approved of and retained by the treasurer, in the penal sum of two hundred dollars, conditioned for the true and faithful discharge of his duties as inspector.

295. It shall be the duty of said inspector to His duty. inspect all salted fish except such as have been inspected agreeably to the laws of the county or state from which they came.

296. The said inspector shall receive for the in-Compensation spection of each barrel, half barrel, or tierce of herrings, five cents; for each barrel, half barrel, or tierce of shad, fifteen cents; and for each kit, or quarter barrel of herrings or shad, three cents.

297. All coopers who may be engaged in the Coopers, under re-cooperage of fish during the time of inspection, spector. shall be under the control of the inspector, who may discharge any cooper who shall refuse, fail or neglect to perform his duties in a workmanlike or satisfactory manner.

298. If any cooper shall refuse to leave any casks cooper reaforesaid, after having received his discharge as afore-when dissaid, and shall persist in working thereon, he shall forfeit and pay the sum of twenty dollars.
