

477. All assaults, riots, or other criminal acts which may be done or committed on the premises aforesaid, shall be cognizable by the criminal court for Baltimore city, in the same manner as if the same had been done or committed within the limits of said city.

Jurisdiction of criminal court extended over premises.

MANURES.

1862, c. 19 repeals sections 486, 487, 488, 490, 491, 492, and 493 of this article, relating to the Inspection and Measurement of Manure. In force from January 7, 1862.

OYSTERS.

1864, c. 368 amends and re-enacts section 494 as follows:

494. All oysters carried to the city of Baltimore for sale, shall be sold by the sealed half bushel, or sealed bushel and half measure, and each and every person offending against the provisions of this section shall be subject to a fine of fifty dollars for each and every offence, to be recovered before a justice of the peace of the city of Baltimore, by action of debt in the name of the state of Maryland, one-half to the informer, and the other half to the use of the state.

TOBACCO.

1864, c. 346 repeals sections from section 494 to section 552 and enacts the following in lieu thereof:

495. The governor, by and with the advice of the senate, shall appoint as soon as possible after the passage of this act, and before the first Monday of February, at each regular session of the general assembly thereafter, five tobacco inspectors, one for each state tobacco warehouse in the city of Baltimore, whose terms of office shall respectively continue until their successors shall qualify; *provided*,
