1862, c. 137 repeals sections 58, 61, 62, 68 and 69 and substitutes the following:

58. On the second Tuesday of April in the year 1862, c. 137 eighteen hundred and sixty-three, shall be appointed missioners. by the orphans' court of Calvert county, one person in each election district in said county, to be denominated the board of commissioners of public schools for Calvert county, who shall be a body corporate and politic, with powers to sue and be sued, and who shall hold their office for four years from the said second Tuesday of April, eighteen hundred and sixty-three, and until their successors are appointed.

61. It shall be the duty of the county commis- Levy for use of sioners annually to levy for the use of the public schools the sum of seven hundred and fifty dollars in payment of interest on money borrowed by the county from the school fund, as by act of eighteen hundred and forty-five, chapter fifty-seven, and the county commissioners shall also annually levy for

any teacher who wilfully refuses or neglects to ob-

serve the same.
