the said office in all things appertaining thereto, and shall also well and truly account for all moneys placed in his hands for collection, and shall well and truly pay all sums of money received by him over to the treasurer of said board of commissioners.

55. The bailiff shall collect all taxes levied by the Balliff's powers commissioners, and pay the same to the treasurer, and duties. and if any person shall neglect or refuse to pay any taxes, or any fines or forfeitures, due by him, her or them, the bailiff may collect the same, in the same manner as county taxes are collected, and if there be any real or personal property in Denton, the owner of which resides in another county or state, the commissioners may order the bailiff to sell so much thereof as will pay the sums due by such owner for taxes, fines or forfeitures, but before selling the property of any non-resident the bailiff shall call on the tenant, if any, on the property, to pay the taxes, fines, penalties or forfeitures due by the owner, and on his failure to pay the same, the commissioners shall give notice in some newspaper, if any printed in the county, where the owner resides at least three weeks before the day of sale; the bailiff shall also attend the meetings of the commissioners, when so required, and perform such service as shall be by them directed: he shall prevent the tumultuous and irregular meetings of disolute and disorderly persons within the town, and disperse them when assembled. by reasonable and lawful means, and he shall have in said town all the powers and perform all the duties of a constable.

56. The president of said board of commissioners, Ibid s. 7. shall preside at all meetings of the commissioners, duties. vote on all questions before them, and remain in office until superseded by the appointment of a new president, after a new election of commissioners: the said president and commissioners shall pass ordinan. Commissionances to regulate the market, inspection, measure ordinances. ment, and weight of all provisions, grain and wood sold in said town, to prevent firing canons, guns,
