The president of the said commissioners shall, Ibid s 25 Power of president in virtue of his office, have and exercise within the dent. limits of said town, all the jurisdiction and power of a justice of the peace, except as to the recovery of small debts; he may call on an officer of the village entrusted with the receipt and expenditure of public money, for a statement of his accounts as often as he shall see proper; he shall see that the ordinances are faithfully executed, and report to the board of commissioners, at their stated meetings, the general state of the village, and may call special meetings of the commissioners whenever he may see proper.

191. The county commissioners of Cecil county 1bid. s. 26. may, at discretion, levy annually upon the assessable missioners property of the county, twenty-five dollars, and pay streets. over to the commissioners, to aid in keeping the streets of said village, as part of the public roads, in

good repair.

192. If the inhabitants of said village at any time Ibid. 27. neglect to make an election as herein directed, the not to forfest power of electing commissioners shall not thereupon cease, but shall continue as though such election had been made, and the president and commissioners for the time being, shall remain in office until such annual election shall be held.

193. The said president and commissioners may 1867, c. 301 Power to borrow, on the faith of the corporation, for the pur-row money to pose of defraying the expenses of paving the streets pave streets. and making sidewalks within the corporate limits of said village, any sum of money not exceeding five thousand dollars; and may issue bonds for the same, To issue bonds. bearing interest at the rate of six per centum per annum, and in such sums and payable at such times as the said president and commissioners may direct, not exceeding twenty years.
