

representatives or assigns shall have the right, within two years after such sale, to redeem any lot so sold, by paying to the purchaser thereof, the amount of purchase money with interest thereon at the rate of six per cent. per annum and five per cent. commission from the day of sale.

54. In case any lot shall be sold for more than may be sufficient to satisfy the taxes and other legal charges thereon, the said commissioners are authorized to invest the said surplus in the bonds of the United States or of the state of Maryland for the benefit of the legal owner of said lot or his legal representatives, and in case such owner or his legal representatives shall not demand the same within two years after such sale, the said commissioners are hereby authorized to expend the same for the interest, benefit and improvement of said town, according to their discretion.

HUCKSTERS.

See under Public Local Laws, Art. I, Allegany county, the act of 1867, c. 272, protecting persons known as hucksters in Washington, Allegany and Harford counties.

ORPHANS' COURT.

1864, c. 245 which amended and re-enacted section 91, is repealed, amended and re-enacted by 1866, c. 159 as follows:

1866, c. 159

Terms

91. The judges of the orphans' court for Harford county shall meet on the first Monday and Tuesday of each month during the year, if the public business require it, to which terms all processes shall be made returnable; and the said court may at each term adjourn from day to day, if the public business require it, for a period not exceeding four days at any one term,

NOTE—1864, c. 245 which provided for the compensation of the judges of the Orphans' Court is repealed by 1865, c. 169 which act repeals all sections of the articles of the Public Local Laws relating to pay and mileage of the judges of the Orphans' Courts of the State and fixes a uniform compensation.
