

nal offences or otherwise, such compensation as the tax commissioners of said county may, in their discretion, from time to time allow to be levied and collected according to law; *provided*, the said commissioners do not at any time allow more than the sum of fifty cents per day for each person. Proviso.

1862, c. 246 adds the following:

75. He shall be allowed a fee of one dollar for every committal of a prisoner to the jail of the county in addition to the amounts allowed him under the preceding section. 1862, c. 264. Pay for committing prisoners.

76. He shall be allowed fifty cents for every warrant delivered by him to the judges of election for the county. For delivering warrants to judges of election.

77. It shall be his duty to attend in person, or by deputy, the circuit court, whether sitting in law or equity, and the orphans' court, whenever the said courts, or either of them shall be in session, and for every day's attendance at each of said courts he shall be allowed the sum of two dollars; but the said sheriff, or his deputy shall perform the duties of bailiff in the orphans' court when required by the court. To attend courts. Pay. Bailiff of orphans' court.
