BRIDGE AT CRUMPTON.

1864, c. 196 enacts as follows:

- 35. The county commissioners for Kent and Queen 1864, c 169, s. 1. Anne's counties, are authorized and required to levy of Kent and upon the assessable property of their respective count of repair bridge ties, one-half of the sum necessary to repair the free bridge over Chester river, at a place called Crumpton, and shall yearly make such further levies as may be necessary to keep said bridge in good repair.
- 36. The county commissioners of said counties, are Ibid s. 2.

 Bridge to be authorized to employ some suitable person or persons repaired. to repair said bridge, in such manner and upon such terms as said commissioners shall determine.
- 37. The said county commissioners shall employ Ibid. s 3. some person to have charge of said bridge, who shall Bridge keeper. attend every day from sunrise to sunset to open the draw for the passage of vessels, and shall receive as a compensation, seventy-five dollars per year for Compensation, such service.

CHESTERTOWN.

1864, c. 277 adds the following:

38. The commissioners of Chestertown may ap- 1804, c 277. point the collector of taxes for Kent county, or of of town to the district of which Chestertown forms a part, to tor of taxes. collect the corporation tax of said town from time to time, and the collector so appointed, shall be bound to give bond, and collect the said taxes according to Bond and compensation. the terms and provisions of the forty-seventh section, of this article, under the penalty of fifty dollars, to be recovered by indictment by the grand jury, and judgment of the circuit court for Kent county, as in ordinary cases of punishment; and the said collector shall receive the same compensation for collecting said tax, as he may receive from the county commissioners for collecting the county tax.
