except such as relate to the service of civil process or collection of debts, but may serve any process for the collection of fines and forfeitures aforesaid.

168. The said commissioners, or a majority of them, Ibid. s. 12. shall have full power and authority to straighten and ers to lay out, widen old streets and to lay out and grade new ones widen streets. when in their discretion the same may be considered necessary, and they shall have full power to provide for the payment of damages and expenses incurred Damages. by widening or opening the streets aforesaid by levying and assessing the same generally upon the whole assessable property of said town or upon the property of persons benefitted thereby.
