

any and what damage he has sustained; to provide ^{Award.} for collecting and paying the compensation awarded to any person before any street or alley shall be so opened or extended, and to enact all ordinances from time to time necessary and proper to the exercise of the powers granted in this section; *provided*, that ^{PROVISO.} before the mayor and council proceed to execute any of the powers vested in them by this section, at least thirty days' notice shall be given of any application which may be made for the passage of any such ordinance, by advertisement, in at least one newspaper printed in said city. Upon the return ^{Assessment to be published.} of any assessment made under any ordinance passed under the preceding section, the clerk of said town shall cause a copy thereof to be published for thirty days in one newspaper printed in said town.

1864, c. 146 repeals section 124 and enacts the following in lieu thereof:

124. The mayor and council may direct and provide for leveling and paving the streets, alleys, foot- ^{1864, c. 146 Corporation empowered to pave, bridge and light the streets.} ways and lanes in said town, or any of them; may grade the same and direct repairs upon them when they think proper; may cause bridges or culverts to be made over the waters or hollows; may contract with the citizens of the town for paving the streets, alleys and lanes in such manner as they may by ordinance direct; may erect lamps in any of the streets of said town; cause the same to be lighted at the expense of the town; may levy upon ^{To levy for expenses.} the taxable property in said town an amount sufficient to defray the expense attending the same, which taxes may be collected as other taxes are provided for in section one hundred and thirty-six of this article.
