### HUCKSTERS.

See the act of 1867, c. 272 under Public Local Laws, Art. I, Allegany county, relating to hucksters in said county and in Harford and Washington counties.

## JURORS.

See under Public Local Laws, Art. VII, Carroll county, the act of 1867, c. 32 providing for the selection, drawing and summoning of juries in Washington Frederick and Carroll counties.

#### LICENSES.

## 1867, c. 98 enacts the following:

176. From and after the first day of April, 1867, c. 98, s. 1. eighteen hundred and sixty-seven, it shall not be carriages, harlawful for any person or persons to bring into Wash-ness, farming utensils, &c. ington county any carriages, hacks, gigs, buggywagons, harness, wheat drills, reapers, horse-rakes, ploughs or any description of farming utensils or goods not manufactured in the state, to be sold on commission or otherwise without first obtaining a license for that purpose.

177. The clerk of the circuit court for Washington Ibid. 8. 2. county, upon application for license for the purpose when clerk of countil to issue mentioned in the first section of this act, shall issue license. such license upon the payment of forty dollars, and such license shall be renewed annually.

178. Any person duly convicted of violating any of the provisions of this act shall be subject to a fine Penalty for not taking out of not less than twenty nor more than fifty dollars license. for each and every such offence, recoverable as small debts out of court are recovered, and one-half of said fine shall be appropriated to the use of the state, the other half for the use of the informer, who is hereby

made a competent witness.

# ORPHANS' COURT.

1864, c. 355 amends and re-enacts section 227 as follows:

227. The per diem of each judge of the orphans' Judges' per court for said county shall be three dollars for each diem. day's service.
