- 46. In case of the death or permanent disability of the commanding officer aforesaid, the commissioners aforesaid shall have authority to fill the vacancy.

To enable the said commissioners to equip and put into service the oyster police force, the sum of eight thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be deemed necessary, in addition to the sum of twenty-two thousand dollars hereinbefore mentioned, is hereby appropriated, which shall be paid by the treasurer, upon the requisition of said commissioners and the warrant of the comptroller.

1868, c 228, s. 1 Dragging or dredging for oysters on Honga and Nantrooke rivers above Roaring Point, in Dorchester county, &c. 50. It shall not be lawful for any person or persons to take or catch oysters with rakes, drags or dredge within the waters of the Honga river in Dorchester county, nor in the Nanticoke river at or above Roaring Point in Dorchester and Wicomico counties, in quantities over five bushels in any one day during the
