

notice, and may compel the production of the books of said corporation, and also fine the president or other officer for not giving the required certificate. Books.

201. When the sheriff has ascertained the number of shares of stock, and amount of such debt standing in the name of the defendant, he shall make a schedule of such shares or debt, or so much thereof as will be amply sufficient to secure the sum of money he is required to levy, and costs, and shall give notice to the corporation that the stock or debt not included in his schedule is released. Schedule of shares or debt.

202. If the levy be made under a *feri facias*, the sheriff shall advertise and sell the stock or debt as if the same were real estate. Notice to corporation.

203. If any corporation or its officers, after service of notice of seizure as aforesaid, shall transfer or permit to be transferred, any shares of stock or any debt standing at the time of service in the name of the defendant, unless the same is released, as hereinafter provided, such corporation shall pay to the plaintiff in the writ under which such notice was given, the full market value of the stock or debt so transferred, to be recovered by suit. Advertisement and sale.

204. If the proceedings under such writ be ended by countermand, payment or any other cause before a sale, the stock seized thereunder shall be released, and the sheriff shall give notice thereof in writing to the corporation. Transfer after seizure.

205. If the sheriff shall make sale of any shares of stock or transferable debt, whether he continues in office or not, or whether he has returned the writ under which the sale was made or not, he shall transfer the said stock or debt so sold on the books of the corporation to the purchaser; or if the sheriff making such sale shall die or remove from the county without making such transfer, the court to which the writ was returnable may appoint a person to make the same. Discontinuance of proceedings.

206. If any corporation or any of its officers shall refuse to permit any transfer authorized to be made by the preceding section, the court to which the writ by Sale by sheriff and transfer to purchaser.
