

ELECTIONS.

1870, c. 264 amends 1868, c. 138 [Sup. 1868, p. 307] by adding the following :

1870, c. 264.
County commissioners may
change district
lines on petition.

Proviso.

SEC. 40. Sub-Sec. 8. The county commissioners of Charles county shall have power, upon petition of any voter or voters of said county interested in a change of the division lines between the several election districts of the county, as laid off under this act, to correct and change said lines, when in their discretion such correction and change will contribute to public convenience ; *provided*, three weeks previous notice of such petition shall have been given in any newspaper published in said county, or if no newspaper in the county, by notices set up at the court house door, and at three public places in the districts to be affected by such change or changes.

Approved and in force April 4, 1870.

JUSTICES OF THE PEACE AND CONSTABLES.

1870, c. 57 repeals sections 50 and re-enacts the same as follows :

Number in each
district.

50. There shall be the following number of justices of the peace and constables in Charles county, to wit : For election district, number one, one justice of the peace and two constables ; for election district, number two, two justices of the peace and two constables ; for election district, number three, three justices of the peace and two constables ; for election district, number four, two justices of the peace and two constables ; for election district, number five, one justice of the peace and two constables ; for election district, number six, two justices of the peace and two constables ; for election district, number seven, one justice of the peace and
