

county for not more than forty days, nor shall any fine imposed exceed twenty dollars for any one offence; *provided*, that nothing herein contained shall be construed to deprive any person convicted before a justice of the peace, under the provisions of this section, of the right of appeal to the circuit court for Frederick county.

Proviso.

Fines, &c., how recovered. 346. All fines and forfeitures shall be recovered in the name and for the use of the burgess and commissioners of Woodsboro', and all commitments shall be signed by the burgess, or a justice of the peace residing within the corporate limits.

HORSES AND CARRIAGES AT LIVERY.

1870, c. 155 adds the following:

1870, c. 155.
Stable keeper
may retain
horse, &c.

347. It shall be lawful for any livery stable-keeper in Frederick town to retain in his custody any horse, mare or gelding, placed under his care for livery, and also any vehicle, until all charges for so keeping shall have been paid by the owner or owners thereof.

May sell horse,
&c. to pay
charges.

348. It shall and may be lawful for such livery stable-keeper to sell any such horse, mare or gelding, or vehicle at public auction, for cash, in Frederick town, after giving at least three weeks public notice of the time, place and terms of sale in one or more newspapers published in Frederick town prior to the day of sale, and after deducting the amount due for keeping, together with all expenses attending such sale, then to pay over the surplus, if any, to the owner of such horse, mare or gelding, or vehicle.

Proceedings
before sale.

349. Before proceeding as above, it shall be necessary for such livery stable-keeper to state an account for the keeping of such horse, mare or gelding, or vehicle, and prove the same before a justice of the peace for the county of Frederick, who, upon being satisfied by proof of demand, and refusal or neglect to pay on the part of the owner, shall thereupon issue his
