

sent to them for their inspection an exact account of all his receipts and expenditures, and a true and faithful exhibit of all moneys that have come into his hands and been paid out by him, and shall perform such other duties as the county commissioners may from time to time require; he shall receive such compensation as the county commissioners shall think proper to allow, not more than fifteen hundred dollars per year, and at the expiration of his term of office he shall transfer and deliver to his successor in office all books, accounts and papers of every kind connected with his office, and all money belonging to the county that may be in his custody and charge as treasurer aforesaid.

List of delinquent tax payers to be published.

Sub-Sec. 5. If said county commissioners shall deem it conducive to the public interest to appoint a collector for each collection district of said county or a collector for one or more of said districts, it shall be the duty of the several collectors of taxes to pay over under oath to the treasurer of the state of Maryland and the treasurer of Washington county, on the first Tuesday of the next month after the said taxes are placed in their hands for collection, and on the first Tuesday in each and every month thereafter, and oftener if required by the county commissioners, the amount collected by them, until the collections are completed; and on failure to make such monthly or other payments, the delinquent collector may be removed from office by the county commissioners and another appointed in his stead, and at the end of the time allowed by law for the collections aforesaid by said collectors, they and each of them shall make to the county treasurer a full and complete return, under oath, of the whole amount of taxes collected by them during the year, and also an alphabetical list of all delinquent tax payers in their respective tax collection districts, and the sums due by each of them, which lists the county commissioners are authorized to have published in at least one newspaper published in the county, and on a failure to complete within twelve months from the day of receiving said taxes for collection, the collection
