1868, c. 155, repeals so much of s. 1 of 1860, c. 303, as provides that the treasurer shall not pay more than one-fourth of the whole amount of money applied under that act, in any one year.

See 1870, c. 275, entitled an act to provide for the renewal of certain bonds and certificates of indebtedment of the state already due, and of others falling due in the year 1870; and to provide for the sale of certain stocks of the state, to pay the holders of said bonds who may demand payment thereof, under article 34, "Debt — Public."

1872, c. 276, an act to provide for cancelling certain stocks or bonds of the state, and other purposes, under article 34, "Debt — Public."

1872, c. 104, allows an additional clerk in the office of treasurer.
